

Minutes of Regular Meeting
Princeton Parks & Recreation Board

Pioneer Park: Gerold said that there has been a lot of snow shoeing and cross country skiing at the park.

Riverside and Riverview Parks: Gerold is trying to figure out how to address the buckthorn issue.

MISCELLANEOUS

SHIP Grant: Fuhrman said that we had received a grant for 23 signs and 6 tables. She had a map with suggested locations and content for each of the signs. We discussed sign styles and locations further to help with the final selections. The high school is also working on six or seven bike racks – completion no later than the end of the school year. We discussed some locations for those but made no commitments.

Skating Rink Question: Chapman had gotten a question about why we don't have a skating rink to which Gerold responded that we do, by the Civic Center. Frederick also said that the hockey association's outdoor rink is sometimes open as well and will be getting lighting and glass in the future.

Adjournment There being no further discussion, Chapman made a motion to adjourn. Broding seconded the motion. Meeting adjourned at 6:22.
